

> PEKIN, January 17 - Officials of Shansi province have recovered from the Pekin syndicate, a British corporation, all the concession rights held by the syndicate in Shansi. The long negotiations in an endeavor to reach a compromise were closed yesterday by the syndicate agreeing to accept 7,700,000 taels, payable in four years, and quit the province. The matter of "rights of recovery" recently has brought about the sole rights of the demonstrations against rights over the immense mineral fields in Shansi. So incensed were the in-
