Sunday, July 28th, — was a beautiful yet very busy day. More than four thousand pilgrims visited the Basilica that day, and three-fourths of them came from Quebec. The Rev. Father H. Bouffard brought

twelve hundred of his parishioners from St. Malo, and the Reverend Fathers Garceau and Proulx, S. J. led 1800 souls of St. Roch's Congregation before the Shrine of Saint Ann. At 10 o'clock they all assisted at a solemn high mass said by Rvd. Father Garceau, S. J. At 2 o'clock in the afternoon, both parishes joined in one of the largest processions held this year in Beaupré. Think of 3000 people praying and singing aloud the praises and glories of Good Saint Ann!

Whence did the other thousand pilgrims come? Well, the « Three Rivers » brought 400 men from St. Ann's parish, Montreal. They were accompanied by their dearly beloved parish priest, Rvd. Father Caron, who was assisted by two of his vicars, Rvd. E. Strubbe and Fortier.
