TORONTO HOSPITAL REPORTS.

SUMMARY OF CASES UNDER THE CARE OF DR CANNIFF.

(Reported by Mr. Abbott, Clinical Clerk.)

Bridget B, aged 29, native of Canada, admitted 30th September, 1870—typhoid fever. So far as we can learn, has been unwell for several days, a good deal of lever, skin being very dry. Was ordered a warm bath, after which she continued to sweat freely for 21 hours. The warm bath has been used in several cases where typhoid by mptoms had not become too well marked. The bowels were found to be relaxed, to relieve which three grains of sugar of lead with a few grains of gingor were given. Load is the astringent usually administered, and mostly always with the desired effect. Sometimes the doss was much enlarged, and occasionally it was continued for even two and three weeks with a few intermissions. No unpleasant effects were ever romarked.
