King Hussein visit to Canada required extensive follow-up.

Visit by CIDA and EXTOTT Desk Officers for Jordan required required planning and follow-up.

Food Aid donation to Jordan required large amount of input
from Commercial Section in attempt to achieve grain sales.

Visit by CIDA Industrial Cooperation Manager was oriented to commercial (private) sector in Jordan.

Negotiations of CANAC project in Jordan grew increasingly complex and required heavy post participation.

New Brunswick Potato Project required larger than expected amount of resources due to surprisingly positive response.

TEMIC Seminars took greater than expected coordination by Section officers.

Annual Grain Market Survey required extensive effort due to

local draught conditions causing market disruptions.

Retirement of Commercial Officer and extended leave of support PY required staffing action of 2 positions.

Short-term arrears on EDC loans required intervention of Embassy.
