2. If so, (a) what number in each province; (b) from and to what locations in the Province of Quebec, and for what reason in each case?

Question No. 254, by Mr. McWilliam,—Order of the House for a Return showing: 1. What regulations govern the establishment of rural mail delivery?

2. What steps should be followed by a group of citizens who wish to have such a service?

Question No. 260, by Mr. McWilliam,—Order of the House for a Return showing: 1. Has the Federal Government received requests from the governments of the Provinces of Nova Scotia and New Brunswick for an extension in the terms of the Trans-Canada Highway Agreements?

2. If so, what reply or replies were given to the requests?

By unanimous consent, the House reverted to "Motions".

On motion of Mr. Dupuis, seconded by Mr. Badanai, it was ordered,—That there be laid before this House a copy of Agreement No. 58407 entered into on March 24, 1958, by the Department of Transport and the City of Campbellford, Ontario, with respect to a contribution of \$1,000. for the development of a park on the grounds of the canal leased to the City of Campbellford under Agreement No. 58408; also for a copy of Agreement No. 58408. (\**Notice of Motion No. 64*).

On motion of Mr. Martin (Essex East), seconded by Mr. McIlraith, it was ordered,—That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor-General, praying that he will cause to be laid before this House a copy of all correspondence, letters and telegrams exchanged since January 1, 1959, between the Federal Government and the Government of Nova Scotia on the subject of payments under the Agricultural Prices Stabilization Act.
