PRAYERS

Mr. Hymmen, from the Standing Committee on National Resources and Public Works, presented the First Report of the said Committee, which is as follows:

Pursuant to its Order of Reference of Thursday, March 29, 1973, your Committee has considered Bill C-130, An Act to amend the Emergency Gold Mining Assistance Act, and has agreed to report it without amendment.

A copy of the relevant Minutes of Proceedings and Evidence relating to this Bill (*Issue No. 12*) is tabled.

RULING BY MR. SPEAKER

In the course of giving my views about the motions which are before the House I had expressed the thought that my reservations dealt more precisely with the third report of the committee rather than with the second report. My understanding of this second report was, as the honourable Member for Skeena (Mr. Howard) has said, that the first part deals with the principles, and if there were fault to be found within the terms or wording of the report, it would be found in the last part which reads: "... and to take steps immediately to enter into negotiations with the Indian people with respect to the said title."
