**-DISCUSSION DRAFT-**Short Title

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Ozone-depleting Substances Regulations No. 3 (Products)

Interpretation

2. In these Regulations

"Act" means the Canadian Environmental Protection Act; (Loi)

"bromofluorocarbon" means any of the following substances:

- (a) bromochlorodifluoromethane, molecular formula  $CF_2BrCl$  (halon 1211)
- (b) bromotrifluoromethane, molecular formula  $CF_3Br$  (halon 1301)
- (c) 1,2-dibromotetrafluoroethane, molecular formula  $C_2F_4Br_2$  (halon 2402) (bromofluoroalclane)

"chlorofluorocarbon" means any substance set out in items 10 to 14 of the List of Toxic Substances in Schedule I to the Act; (chlorofluoroalcane)

"chlorofluorocarbon" means any of the following substances:

- (a) trichlorofluoromethane, molecular formula  $CFCl_3$  (CFC-11)
- (b) dichlorofluoromethane, molecular formula  $CF_2Cl_2$  (CFC-12)
- (c) 1,1,2-trichlorotrifluoroethane, molecular formula  $C_2F_3Cl_3$  (CFC-113)
- (d) 1,2-dichlorotetrafluoroethane, molecular formula  $C_2F_4Cl_2$  (CFC-114)
- (e) chloropentafluoroethane, molecular formula  $C_2F_5Cl$  (CFC-115) (chlorofluoroalcane)

"foaming agent" means a chemical added to plastics during manufacture to form minute gas cells throughout the product; (agent de gonflement)

"plastic foam" means a plastic in which the apparent density is decreased substantially by the use of a foaming agent during the manufacturing process. (mousse plastique)

Prohibition

3. (1) Subject to subsections (2), and (3) effective January 1, 1990 no person shall import, manufacture, offer for sale or sell any pressurized container that contains ten kilograms or less of any chlorofluorocarbon, either alone or in a mixture.
