your liberality in the service of God. If it is the duty of your brethren at home to "care for your souls," much more surely is it your own duty. If their poverty does not exempt them from obligations to bestow a portion of their scanty earnings for the purpose of sending you the gospel; what excuse could possibly be made for a miserable and fatal parsimony on your part, to whose labours a new country yields a much richer return? How could you defend it to your own children? How could you defend it at the judgment-seat of Christ?

"And now, bretbren, we commend you to God, and to the word of his grace, which is able to build you up, and to give you an inheritance

among all them who are sanctified."
