BROOKLYN WINS TWO FROM PHILADELPHIA

The First a Tough Battle in

PHILADELPHIA, June 26.—Philadelphia's winning streak was broken today, Brooklyn taking both games of a double-header. The first day's play was a 1-0 victory and the second by 4 to 2. Rucker, who pitched in grand style in the first game, was called to leave his mound to fight the heat, after making a single in the second inning. Curtis finished out the contest and the second pitcher won a victory in a duel with Alexander in the second game. Brooklyn won the opener on singles by Smith, Hummel and Luderus, and errors by Luderus and Killifer in the fourth and fifth innings. Barring this season both games were filled with hits and runs. The second game was won by the visitors, 4 to 2, the ninth inning on doubles by Smith, Hummel and Luderus.
