Thompson, 48th Highlanders, first overseas Can-adian forces, Lark Hill Camb, Salis-bury, under date of Jan. 80, of which the following are extracts: "Our pipe band has been very fucky since we came to England. We have been twice in Bournemouth playing at the Winter Gardens: a couple of the boys danced the Highland Fling' and 'sword dance,' and the band rendered selections. The proceeds were given to the Belgian re-lef fund. We were in the town three days and they took us out to Lynd-nest to visit the Indian troops, who were invalided home. We got our share of the good things at Christmas which were going around, but are now down to hard work, out, every day manoeuvring or else at the ranges. "We are all tifed of this place, lots of mud. We shall set lots of it no doubt in France, but it will be a change. We are/supposed to leave here on Monday, Feb. 1, for parts unknown, but we will make a showing for our-sives when the time comes and do honor to our mother country, Canada, and the Old Flag." 
