BY-LAW NO. 870.

By-Law Authorizing the Renewal of Certain Notes under Discount.

Whereas it will be necessary to renew certain notes or bills at present under discount with the Bank of Montreal, Cornwall, Molsons Bank, Morrisburgh, and Union Bank of Canada, Alexandria, for monies borrowed for the meeting of current expenditure.

Be it enacted a By-Law of the United Coun-

ties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry, that the Warden and Treasurer be and they are hereby authorized to renew the said notes or bills accruing, due from time to time as they may consider necessary, or to retire the same if possible out of the monies which have been levied and collected for County purposes, at that the Warden and Treasurer be authorized to discount a note at the Molsons Bank for sum that together with the amount now under discount, chargeable to Nation River Drainage Account, that will not exceed in all \$12,000.

BY-LAW NO. 871.

By-Law to Re-appoint Committee re River Beaudette Drainage Improvements.

Whereas application has been made to this Council by the Council of Charlottentown to proceed as provided by the Municipal Act of 1883 and amendments thereto, to deepen the River Beaudette in the Townships of Charlottentown and Lancaster, and to remove obstructions therefrom for the purpose of draining the land in the vicinity of the said River and its tributaries.

And whereas it has become necessary to re-appoint the said Committee and provide vacancies occasioned by the members ceasing to be members of this Council.

It is therefore enacted a By-Law of the Corporation of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry, that Donald Cameron, Reeve of Lancaster Township; J. D. McViechie, Deputy-Reeve, Lancaster Township; A. B. McLennan, Reeve, Charlottentown; Geo. Elder, Deputy-Reeve, Charlottentown; John F. McCalum, Deputy-Reeve, Charlottentown; John and D. A. McArthur, Reeve, Alexandria, be the Committee as provided for in the original By-Law, and that the said Committee be authorized to take such action as may be necessary to carry out the intention of the said By-Law.

BY-LAW NO. 872.

By-Law to Grant Permission to the Corporation of the Township of Kenyon to Assume and Lay Out certain Streets in the Village of Apple Hill.

Whereas the Corporation of the Township of Kenyon has petitioned for permission to assume and lay out certain streets in the Village of Apple Hill, of less width than sixty-six feet, and it is expedient to grant permission.

Be it therefore enacted a By-Law of the Corporation of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry, that the Corporation of the Municipality of Kenyon have permission to assume and lay out three certain streets, not less than forty feet wide, known as St. Peter street, St. Joseph street and Kennedy street, in the said Village of Apple Hill.
