The Brampton Company, though originally intended as part of the Battalion, was for some reason exchanged for the Whitby Company.

In the latter part of 1861 and beginning of 1862, other independent companies were organized in the city, some of which were immediately added to the strength of the battalion, viz.: Capt. Latham's Company, as No. 7; Capt. Murray's "2nd Merchant's," as No. 8 Company; and "Trinity College" Company, as No. 9; whilst others did not join until the 21st Nov., 1862, when the corps was increased to a strength of ten companies, the Barrie and Whitby companies again becoming independent, and Captain Latham's Company being transferred to the "10th Royals," of Toronto. The Regiment was then made up of the following companies, as by the *Gazette* of the above date :
