proof of contrition have afforded all the satisfaction in their power to the justice of their country. For this satisfaction we are indebted not more to the perseverance and ability of the reverend Gentleman who so humanely and assiduously attended the wretched sufferers subsequent to their sentence, than to the pious and judicious exertions of our worthy Chief Magistrate, whose conduct, on this occasion, prepared the way for the sacred ministration, and fully manifested, what it has spoken on all others, a determined adherence to justice, conjoined with sentiments of the tenderest regard to the rights, liberties and happy piness of his fellow-subjects.
