Miss Haswell is seen to excellent advantage as Jacqueline. The part suits her admirably and, whether as the innocent and romantic girl, the devoted bride or the jealous and incensed wife, she entered with full spirit and fine art into every phase of the role. There is genuine comedy in the part and the points could not have been better made. The result was a thoroly enjoyable and merry entertainment to which her good, all-round company gave splendid support. Miss Dale as Lucle, Miss Kenwyn as the Marquise and Miss Ogden as Charlotte all gave appropriste characterisations. Earle Browne was again acterisations in New York and London. 
