# HORSE SHOW

At Arena Closing Day

## KOMOKA, MONTROSE, KAKABEKA THE HORSE SHOW CHAMPIONS

Best Attendance of Week Saturday Night—The Wasp and Rupert Tie in High Jump at 7 Feet.

The closing scenes at the big Horse Show Saturday evening in the Market Arena were brilliant. The grand exhibition of horsemanship that it was. Three championships were decided, and also the Governor-General's prize. The attendance was the best of the week, and from the time the first class was called out at 12 o'clock, when the high jump was decided, the spectators were all intensely interested.

The contest for the Governor-General's Cup, for best 4-year-old mare or gelding, was less than 15 hands at top over 15.3, suitable for riding or cavalry purposes, was keenly contested, the blue finally falling to the Hon. Adam Beck's chestnut gelding, Komoka, 15.8 hands, bred by Verona, Silver King, a grey gelding, bred by Hon. W. A. Young, and entered by P. D. Parsons, of Guelph, by the same sire, was awarded third prize.

Montrose again beat Sparkle in Class 16, for single high-steppers, and also won the ring and won the championship for single horse in harness. This horse is about five feet in front, but his action behind is one of the best. The movement of Sparkle was much better and more appreciated by the spectators, but the little mare lacks size, which was apparently important in the class.

Troy & Murray's four-in-hand were much the best and won handsily. They were ably helped by James Murray.

Mrs. J. A. Dixon, on Othello, won the blue ribbon for best lady's model horse. Othello was the best-natured of those in competition. He also won the championship for best model horse at the show.

In Class 41, for amateur heavy-weight hunters, Kenebec was placed ahead of Kakabeka, with Grey Franz third. The first and second place winners are the property of the Hon. Adam Beck, but in the championship class for hunters the judges reversed the horses and placed Kakabeka first, which was quite proper. In fact, Kenebec should not have been placed ahead of his superior in the amateur class. Kakabeka is a grandly made 5-year-old chestnut gelding, bred by Mr. Beck. His sire is the good horse, Imp, Grand Father, and his dam is a sister of the highest class, for Kakabeka is the best of the kind ever seen in a show ring in this city.

Specifications of the quality and quantity of coal required, and form of application, may be obtained on application to the Department or from the Bureau of the respective institutions.
