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In the face of Commissioner Fleming's hostile report, the Property Committee could not decently transfer the cattle market franchise from the citizens, to whom it belongs, to the Union Stock Yards Company, which has evasive designs upon it. But the company and the aldermen who are supporting it in this deal intend to carry the project through at all hazards, and they will do so unless a bold fight is put up by the honest members of the council. The aldermen who favor the scheme most audaciously, and in utter disregard of the best interests of the city. They propose to violate the well-recognized principle of municipal government that all franchises which it is proposed to sell should be advertised and sold to the highest bidder. If the council agrees to the principle of parting with the franchise then it is in duty bound to get the highest price therefor. Ald. Hanlan and the other supporters of the deal have deliberately violated this rule in recommending the sale of the franchise to the Union Stock Yards Company, without competition. But

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THE RAILWAY COMMITTEE MUST IN-

We have read the report of the Board of Trade's committee in regard to the difficulty between the Grand Trunk and the C.P.R., as to North Bay business, and the Grand Trunk and the Parry Sound and Ottawa Railway, as to connections at Scott's Junction, but we saw no indication in the report that the committee had considered the advisability of appealing to the Minister of Railways for relief. The question was asked in Parliament whether the Minister intended to interfere, and to compel these several roads to serve the public to the best of their ability instead of, as they now are doing, inconveniencing everyone. The Minister answered in Parliament that he was considering the question, but had as yet reached no decision. We believe the Minister has ample powers to protect the public, and if the Board of Trade takes the case to him, and if he summons the several parties to the Railway Committee, a speedy settlement might be effected. Writing letters from one railroad to another and comparing them takes up a lot of time without giving a result. Summon the roads before the Railway Committee and the whole facts will be ascertained within two hours, because each party will state clearly where he is, what his objections are and what he is prepared to do. Then the Minister can come in and say so and so must be done, because it is in the public interest. This is a quick and speedy way of ascertaining the rights of the public in the
