-Statistical News Very Bearish-

Tuesday Evening, May 31.

To-day saw the bottom drop out of Leiters' famous May wheat market, and the later deliveries slumped sharply. The chief cause of the heavy condition of wheat was to be found in the statistical news of the day. During the past week the world's wheat shipments were enormous, aggregating about 13,000,000 bushels, or more than double those for the corresponding week last year. Russia and India espechily sent unusuady large quantities to Europe. The visible supply in Canada and the United States increased 587,000 bushels. On top of all this came reports indicating a big American wheat crop. The opening on the Chicago board was weak, and from \$1.75 on Saturday May wheat dropped a clear 50c per bushel and closed at \$1.25. The July delivery declined nearly 10c a bushel and closed at 97%c, 64%c below Saturday's final figure. The September option fell to 80%c, but recovered to \$14/c, 26 below the last closing. The December option touched 78%c and closed at 70%c, a loss of ½c for the day.

Corresponding losses occurred in the other United States markets, and at Torter.

The British grain markets were closed. Antwerp stood steady, and Paris unexpectedly reported big advances in wheat and flour. In wheat the rise was 40 to 70 centimes, and in flour 1 franc to 4 france and 55 centimes. This strength for the French market was responsible for the late partial recovery at Chicago. Corn, which usually sympathizes with wheat, broke away to day and advanced nearly a cent on the Chicago board. Oats and provisions were higher, the latter on the strength of the new French treaty, which admits some American hog products at a lower rate of duty.

The incoming wheat crop of France is estimated at from 369,000,000 to 383,000,000 bushels. Even the smaller figure would leave an exportable surplus.

Receipts of wheat at Minneapolis and Duluth to-day 985 cars, as compared with 1087 cars the corresponding day of last year.

Stocks of wheat at Fort William and Port Arthur to-day total 572,205 bushels, compared with 1,704,318 bushels the cor-responding day of 1897.

Thus the wheat on passage increased 3,280,000 bushels last week, and corn on passage increased 400,000 bushels. The amount of wheat afloat a year ago was 18,560,000 bushels; corn 10,180,000 bushels. To recapitulate, the visible supply of wheat in Canada and the United States, together with that afloat to Europe, is 69,272,000 bushels, against 65,405,000 bushels a week ago, and 45,457,000 bushels a year ago.
