

MR. SEALEY'S RELATIVES GET GOVERNMENT JOBS

Two of Them Provided For in Short Time—City Controllers to Get \$1200 a Year.

HAMILTON, Ont., Oct. 22.—(Special.)—Altogether has represented Wentworth the house of commons for a few months only, W. O. Sealey is already providing his relatives with government jobs. Last spring all the tenders at the Beach swing bridge were discharged, and Mr. Sealey appointed his brother-in-law, Mr. Tunis, as foreman of the new gang. Last Saturday, Robert McKeehan, collector of customs as Dundas, was found dead in his bed and to-day it was announced that C. W. Sealey, the member's nephew, had been appointed to the post of \$1200 a year. These appointments have raised a big row amongst the stalwart members of the liberal party in this county.

Similar conditions, existed in all cities, and it was the duty of all good citizens to keep young men and women from danger. Rev. J. J. McCoombe, also spoke. Alfred Powis presided.

J. N. Collins, Toronto, secretary of the Royal Astronomical Society, held this evening before the Hamilton section of the society, on the development of the astronomical ideas.

Controllers at \$1200 a Year. The committee named to define the duties of the controller of the new committee of the council met this afternoon. It was agreed that the salary of controllers should be \$1200 a year. Their powers will not be as large as was first thought, because it takes a two-thirds vote of the council to appoint or dismiss an official. Instead of the present committee there will be the following: Committee on works, committee on property, harbor and fisheries, committee on fire, police, waterworks department, committee on legislation and reception, committee on court house, each committee, with the exception of the works, which will have nine members, will be made up of seven aldermen and a controller. The works committee will have charge of the board, which sewers and waterworks department, which will be amalgamated. It was decided to take the garbage collection place it under the works committee, the building inspector to be placed under the same committee.

The late E. Fisher of the T. H. B. is \$20,000, all of which will go to his son.

Hamilton will likely make an effort to persuade the government to build the new Welland Canal along the Grand River route, so that it will pass near Hamilton.

The stock of the Hamilton Steel and Iron Company has jumped from \$9 to 125. It is said that a group of Toronto and Montreal capitalists joining with William Southern, and other Hamilton men, are trying to get control and that they are seeking to buy the Willcox-Doolittle interests for \$300,000. These interests are said to be willing to sell for \$1,000,000. The present directors of the company are: William Southern, C. Wilcox, C. E. Doolittle, George S. Lynch-Staunton, K.C., Robert Hobson and A. E. Carpenter. About a year ago the company watered its stock, doubling it, so that shareholders have reaped an increase of 150 per cent. A. B. Mackay is representing the capitalists who are trying to secure control of the company.

Lieut. Thomas Heath has been appointed chief of the Saskatoon fire department to succeed Chief Gilbert, who resigned the position.

Nearly Electrocutted. Ernest Wright, employed in the Cataract Power Company's sub-station on Victoria-avenue, was badly burned and had a narrow escape from electrocution last night. In order to save him, the current supplying lights to a large part of the city had to be thrown off. He received a shock of 500 volts.

Canadian Temperance League. This year's opening meeting of the Canadian Temperance League is likely to be one of the greatest every way of any in the past twenty-five years, and that is saying considerable.

The opening meeting will take place on Sunday, first inst., as usual in Massey Hall, and at the usual hour. The speaker of the day will be Dr. Dan McGarr, lecturer from Kansas, sometimes called the "Great Irish Preacher." The chairman will be Sir James Whitney, and a first-class singer is to be provided.
