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## BLOODDISEASES

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Three Out of Four Bills Pass.

ALBANY, May 27.—Three of the four bills introduced by Senator Agnew and Assemblyman Perkins, designed to prevent gambling at race-tracks, have passed the legislature. The Penkins bill, making more stringent the provisions of the law in relation to keeping gaming and betting establishments, went thru the assembly to-day by a vote of 83 to 27. The Agnew bill, prohibiting the publication of betting odds on horse races, failed to receive the approval of the assembly rules committee.

An attempt was made in the senate to-day in the nai legislative rush to hold up one of the bills which had passed that house, but failed because the bill was beyond the jurisdiction of the senate.
