DREADFUL SLAUGHTER

But the Russians Suffered the Most Severely.

FACE TO FACE.

The Two Armies Are in Touch, with Desultory Fighting, and Another Great Battle May be Looked for Very Soon--The Weather is Cold.

So far as the despatches from the Far East show, there has been no change in the relative positions of the hostile armies confronting each other on the line of the Shalke river. There is an unconfirmed report that a Russian force of 20,000 men has been concentrated at Kauts pass, 30 miles northwest of Liao Yang, which may be indicative of the direction in which General Kuropatkin is likely to strike his next blow. Upward of 20,000 of the Russian soldiers wounded in the battle of Shalke have reached Harbin. Cold weather is causing suffering to the armies in the field, although it has wrought an improvement in the conditions for the movement of troops. A report has reached St. Petersburg, but lacks confirmation, that the Fort Arthur fleet has left its anchorage in the harbor and has taken up a position in the roadstead.

St. Petersburg, Oct. 24--Emperor Nicholas has received the following despatch from General Kuropatkin, dated Oct. 23: "The fight of Oct. 22-23 passed quietly. At nine o'clock this morning (Sunday) the whole of our volunteer sharpshooters harassed the enemy while the Japanese tried to attack our outposts but were repulsed by the Russian fire."

Desultory Fighting. St. Petersburg, Oct. 23--Lieut. General Sakharov, in a despatch dated Oct. 22, says: "There is no serious fighting, but there has been a desultory artillery duel throughout the day. The Russian batteries bombarded the portion of the village of Linshupu, occupied by Japanese as well as Shalke station and the village of Lanung, while the enemy bombarded the position of Linshupu, in the occupation of the Russians, and the village of Shalke."

Mukden, Oct. 22--The Russians on Friday and Saturday, bombarded the villages of Lanung, Shalke station, Sarvenstey and Shalke station, which the Japanese have now completely evacuated. A party of Russians approached on a hand car to a point within less than a mile of the station and no Japanese was visible. The Japanese reply to the Russian artillery fire is extremely weak, but the rifle fusade of the outer trenches is incessant. It is only possible to bring up provisions and water by stealth at night, in kegs on donkey backs, as the Japanese riflemen pick off the drivers.

Dreadful Slaughter. Tokio, Oct. 24--Afternoon--The Japanese headquarters today to-day, without referring to the general situation in the vicinity of the Shalke River, published the following report yesterday: "Since the last telegram referring to the enemy's dead, the bodies left on the field have been increased to the following: Found by the right army, 5,200; Found by the left army, 5,600; Found by the center army, 5,350. Total, 16,150. The number of prisoners captured totals 709."

Washington, Oct. 22--The Japanese legation today received the following cablegram from Tokio: "Marshal Oyama reports that the investigation completed Oct. 22 regarding the Russian losses at the battle of Shalke shows that there were about 500 prisoners and 10,500 dead bodies. The trophies of the battle are 35 guns, 6,920 shells, 5,674 rifles, 78,000 ammunicions, etc. The dead of the enemy were all buried with military honors. The Russian total casualties are estimated at 60,000. Further investigation is still proceeding."

With General Oku's army in the field, via Fusan, Oct. 22--The Japanese of the left army report their casualties to date as 5,100. These include comparatively few killed, and many were only slightly wounded. Five thousand Russian dead have been buried by the Japanese who estimate that the Russians removed about 2,000. It is believed that the Russian casualties before the left army equals an army corps. The right army (General Kuroki's) reports fewer losses than the left army, but there have been greater Russian casualties before it. St. Petersburg, Oct. 22--The war office admits Russian casualties of 40,000 and claims the Japanese lost about 30,000. The associated Press learns that a portion of the eighth army corps, which had reached Harbin, is hurrying southward. The Japanese estimate that the Russian losses in the battle of Shalke amount to 60,000, it is not confirmed here.

A telegram from Harbin reports the passage north of 26,000 wounded. The remainder who are quartered in hospitals at Mukden, cannot exceed a few thousand.
