I, *A. B.* do sincerely promise and swear, that I will
be faithful and bear true allegiance to his majesty, king
George : *So help me God.*

OATH of SUPREMACY.

I, *A. B.* do solemnly promise and swear, that I do
from my heart abhor, detest and abjure, as impious and
heretical, that damnable doctrine and position, that
princes excommunicated or deprived by the pope, or
any authority of the see of Rome, may be deposed and
murdered by their subjects, or any other whatsoever.
And I do declare, that no foreign prince, person, pre-
late, state, or potentate, hath, or ought to have, any ju-
risdiction, power, superiority, pre-eminence, or autho-
rity, ecclesiastical or spiritual, within this realm : *So
help me God.*

OATH of ABJURATION.

I, *A. B.* do truly and sincerely acknowledge, profess,
testify and declare, in my conscience, before God, and
the world, that our sovereign lord king George is lawful
and rightful heir of this realm, and all other his majes-
ty's dominions thereunto belonging. And I do solemn-
ly and sincerely declare, that I do believe in my con-
science, that not one of the descendants of the person

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
