

PRINCE OF WALES ENJOYS OTTAWA

Brilliant Reception and State Dinner Were Features Yesterday—May Play Golf.

Ottawa, Ont., Oct. 17.—No engagements have been announced for the Prince of Wales today, it being most likely that the royal visitor will take a rest during the day, although, as he did during his last Ottawa visit, he may play golf. This evening there will be a dance at Government House, to which many of the younger set of the city have been invited.

The most notable event connected with the Prince's visit was the reception given by Their Excellencies, the Governor General and Lady Byng at Government House last night, when upwards of three hundred guests, representative of the Parliamentary, diplomatic, military, civil and social life of the capital took advantage of the opportunity to extend their respects to the heir to the throne.

The reception was held in the ballroom, where each guest was presented to the Prince. During the evening a delightful programme of music was rendered by the orchestra from the regimental band of the Governor General's Foot Guards. The members of the orchestra were uniformed in the pre-war full dress scarlet tunics of the Guards regiment, which recalled proud memories of former days, and added a brilliant touch of color to the happy scene.

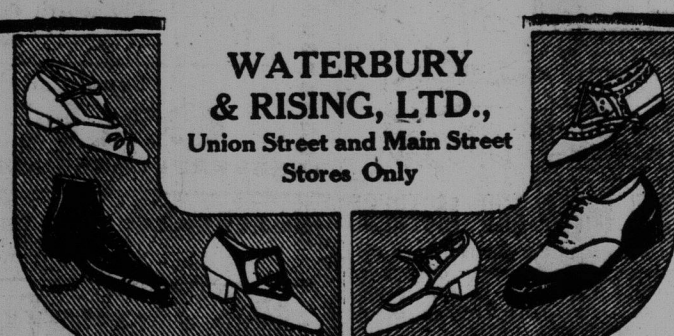

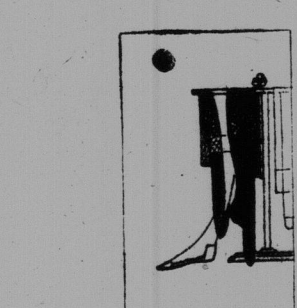

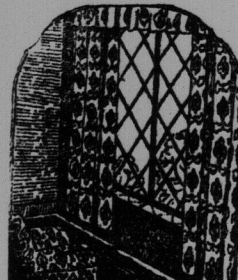
