

# WHAT'S DOING IN THE MONEY AND STOCK MARKETS TODAY

## REDUCTION OF CAPITAL STOCK OF B. E. STEEL

Montreal, March 7.—The Gazette financial editor says: The New York stock exchange has received notice from the British Empire Steel Corporation, Limited, of proposed reduction in authorized capital stock of \$15,000,000 seven per cent non-cumulative preference stock, and reduction in eight per cent cumulative first preference stock, series A, from \$100,000,000 to \$80,000,000, seven per cent cumulative second preference stock from \$185,000,000 to \$175,000,000, and common stock from \$210,000,000 to \$175,000,000.

## ANNUAL REPORT OF THE STEEL CO. OF CANADA

Montreal, March 7.—The report of the operations of the Steel Company of Canada, Limited, for the year to December 31, 1922, as received by the directors of the enterprise here, shows gross profits of \$2,295,197 as compared with \$2,128,866 in 1921. Net earnings, before payment of dividends were \$909,517, against \$817,292 the previous year. After payment of preferred dividends there was left applicable to common stock \$448,856 as against \$362,551 the previous year. This is equivalent to a 5.90 per cent on common stock as compared with 5.15 per cent in 1921. Working capital at the end of 1922 was \$9,907,865, against \$10,553,483 at the end of 1921.

## NEW INDUSTRY IN SCOTLAND. Shipyards Are Now Occupied Breaking Up Former Great Warships.

Scotland has a new industry. It is ship-breaking. The great shipyards which built the mighty British battle ships are now busy demolishing the same ships—some of which took part in the North Sea fights in the World War—and preparing their steel hulks for the melting pot, after which they will be turned into plowshares or some other instruments of peace. The fate of the ships was determined at the Washington Conference on Limitation of Armaments, and it is providing work for hundreds of men at Rosyth, Alloa, Granton, Inverkeithing and BoNESS.

Perhaps the most interesting of the warships to be demolished is the old Dreadnought. This great ship, which when launched in 1906 heralded the world race in armaments, is ending its days in Inverkeithing Bay. It has been purchased for scrap, but as the present owners have to engage their plant, the actual work of tearing her to pieces has had to be delayed.

## NEW ORGANIZATION. Representatives of all the different transportation companies in St. John were present at a meeting in the Board of Trade rooms last evening, when a new organization was formed to be known as the St. John Transportation Association.

A constitution was framed and adopted. The following officers were elected: President, W. M. Collins; vice-president, J. G. Burke; secretary-treasurer, E. S. Hansen; executive committee, C. H. Scott, J. Lord, J. Wood and J. H. McIntyre. The object of the association is to promote harmonious action and intercourse of its members and to deal with all questions affecting the welfare and efficiency of transportation, and also to work in harmony with the Board of Trade in all matters pertaining to the interests of the city and the Port of St. John.

## PRICES IRREGULAR IN WALL STREET

### Resumption of Selling with Fresh Buying Reported—Paper Group Active on Montreal Exchange.

New York, Mar. 7.—(Wall street)—Resumption of yesterday's selling some quarters coincident with fresh buying in others, imparted an irregular trend to opening prices in today's stock market. Domestic oil and copper shares were among the first to move to higher ground, some of the early leaders being California Petroleum, common and preferred, Coder, Shell Transport, Utah and American Smelting. American Agricultural Chemical Pfd, opened two points higher, new buying noted in the first half, Reading opening half-point higher.

Noon Report.

New York, March 7.—(Noon)—Mixed movements continued throughout the morning, some of the selling being attributed to speculative fears of another increase in the federal reserve discount rate in the near future.

Several specialties, which recently have been advanced in rapid fashion, declined abruptly when the pools began to unload. Professional speculators were continued, however, in other groups. Equipments and rubbers showed moderate strength, but motor accessories were weak. Buying of General Asphalt and Cosden, which touched new high records of 58 3/4 and 60 1/2 respectively, failed to check the reaction in other oil shares. Petroleum dropping nearly two points on reports that production of one of its big wells had been drastically reduced. Porto Rico Tobacco, cancelled its early loss and advanced three points. Market Street Railway, second and prior preferred stocks were strong, but Bosch Magneto, Kresge, United Fruit and Stromberg and Nash Motors were conspicuously weak.

Call money opened at 5 per cent.

Montreal Market.

Montreal, Mar. 7.—(10:30)—The opening of trading in the stock market today was marked by the activity displayed by the paper group. Abitibi led all the other issues with an advance of 1/2 point to 107 1/2.

Other features of the market included Steel of Canada up 1/4 to 76 1/2, Consolidated Smelting up 1/2 to 78, Dominion Textile up 1/4 to 69 1/2, National Breweries up 1/4 to 83 and Ottawa Power down 1/4 to 91 1/2. Brazilian at 82 was unchanged.

ALL LIKE U. S. CIGARETTES

Eighty Countries Took 12,000,000,000 Last Year.

New York, March 6.—All the world likes American cigarettes. In 1922, 12,000,000,000 of them were sold, slightly more than 2,000,000,000 in the year preceding the war, and the number of countries to which they were exported in 1922 was eighty, against fifty in 1913. The total value of the exports of cigarettes in 1922 was approximately \$24,000,000, against \$14,000,000 in 1913.

"Curiously," comments the National City Bank, "this growing demand for cigarettes comes chiefly from a district far distant from that in which the war occurred—the Orient. To China alone exports of cigarettes in 1922 were \$6,000,000, against \$1,000,000 in 1913, and the sum sent was \$17,000,000, against \$1,000,000 in 1913.

"Of course, there was a large exportation to Europe, and especially to France, Belgium and Italy, but the sales to the Continent have greatly fallen off since the war, while those to the Orient have gone on increasing. While China is by far the largest single customer, other Oriental countries are also increasing their demand for the American product, which distributes its imports to all parts of the Orient, took in 1922 more than 1,000,000 of our cigarettes, and Hongkong which sends most of its imports to China, took about 600,000,000 in 1922, against 300,000,000 in the year before the war. Siam also shows a growing taste for the American product, and our exports to that country in 1922 were more than double those of the immediately preceding year. India, moreover, has apparently reduced her demand, while Japan is apparently not addicted to the American cigarette habit, for our exports to that country are extremely small and show little disposition to increase.

"That is 'habit' of the American cigarette is not only growing on a world-wide basis is evidenced by the fact that the total number of countries to which our cigarettes were sent in 1922 is approximately eighty, against fifty in the pre-war year 1913, and the value of the exports to the whole world in 1922 was \$24,000,000, against \$14,000,000 in 1913.

"The total value of cigarettes exported from the United States in the eight years since the beginning of the war is \$168,000,000, against \$22,000,000 in the eight years preceding the war. India, tobacco habit seems to have been greatly stimulated since the beginning of the war period, as the total value of our exports to that country in 1913 is \$1,825,000,000, against about \$1,825,000,000 in the eight years immediately preceding the war."

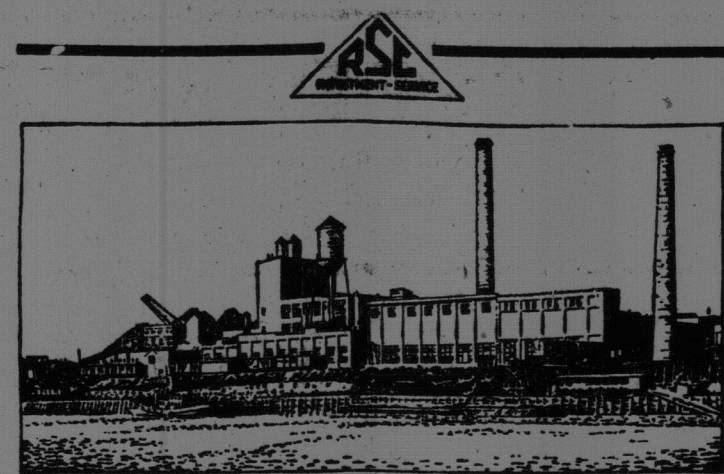
