**"BOY WONDER" WITH RIFLE.**  
Richard Lee Beck, 12 Years Old Has a Perfect Score.

A real "boy wonder" with a rifle has been uncovered in Bridgeport, Ohio. He is Richard Lee Beck and is thirteen years old. For the second year in succession he has won the individual junior rifle championship. In 1919 he tied with twelve other boys, each having a perfect score of 200. This means that every one of the shots at eight targets, shot from four positions, sitting, standing, kneeling and prone, all went through the bull's eye, which is one inch in diameter at a distance of fifty feet. Each of the twelve boys was given five more shots and Beck won.

This year thirteen boys tied for first honors, and again each of them had a perfect score of 200. There was no Club. Richard Lee has defeated all of the members, including his father, Frank Beck, who has been his instructor.

An interesting story is told in connection with Beck's rifle shooting that

proves conclusively just how expert he is. During the summer previous to this, Beck was a member of the National Bank that they were a nuisance, and the bank authorities and Bridgeport officials invited young Beck to clean them out. He fired fifty-eight shots and brought down fifty-eight pigeons, and not one of them was nearer than ten feet.
