SOME ATTACK WILSON AND SOME SUPPORT

Discussion on League of Nations in the Sinn Fein Parliament

Dublin, April 12.—(By the Associated Press)—The Sinn Fein parliament today discussed the league of nations. Prof. Edward De Valera said that Ireland was ready to become a constituent unit, but only on the basis of the equality of rights of all nations, great and small. The whole hope of the world was in President Wilson, he continued, but the league covenant was not democratic; it violated the principle of equality and would set up a greater tyranny than before.

The member for Monaghan attacked President Wilson and called him the "Machiavelli" of the new world, intent on forcing a sham league of nations on prostrate humanity.

Other speakers criticized the American president, but Arthur Griffith, founder of the Sinn Fein organization, said President Wilson was at the present time fighting England, France and Italy, and that Ireland would support him in his conflict with the old diplomacy.
