"Kid Carter's" Case.
James Jennings, a boxer who was known as "Kid Carter" and who was convicted in Boston in last March of killing William H. McPherson, adjudged insane and sent to the State Hospital at Bridgewater, and later taken to Charlestown State Prison at his own request, has been sent back to Bridgewater, the authorities stating that Jennings was too dangerous to keep at that institution.

"Jennings is not right in his head," said Warden Bridges of Charlestown State Prison, in discussing the case, "he has spells when he becomes insane."

Says the Boston Globe:—
Martie Denny, ex-lightweight champion of Australia—and in his day he was all that the word "champion" implies—is another boxer from the land of the kangaroo who has decided to make this country his home. He is operating a cafe in Portland, Ore.

In a letter to a friend here he tells about several boxers who some years ago passed out of the game. Old followers of the sport here often wonder what became of these men and will be interested to know.
Tommy Tracy, an Australian whose bout with Joe Walcott will never be forgotten by the old-time fans, is instructor at the Multnomah Athletic Club in Portland, Gardner, probably one of the toughest featherweights that ever was in the game, has a boxing school in the same city. No matter how important the bout was, Gardner used to either smoke his black cigars or a black pipe up to about the time he was in the ring.

He was one contender for the title that most of the featherweights in those days did not care to meet. Battling Nelson, in his best days never had anything on Gardner for standing a grueling fight.
