

Library fee of one dollar per term during the time that they use the Library, and shall be subject to such rules of the Library as are applicable to them.

All books must be returned to the Library on or before June 24th and December 24th.

Any person retaining a book beyond the time allowed or after the two days mentioned in the preceding paragraph will incur a fine of two cents a day till the return of the book.

Non-residents of Toronto must prepay the charges for the carriage of books both ways.

Loss of books or damage done to books must be made good by the person in whose name the book is taken out.
