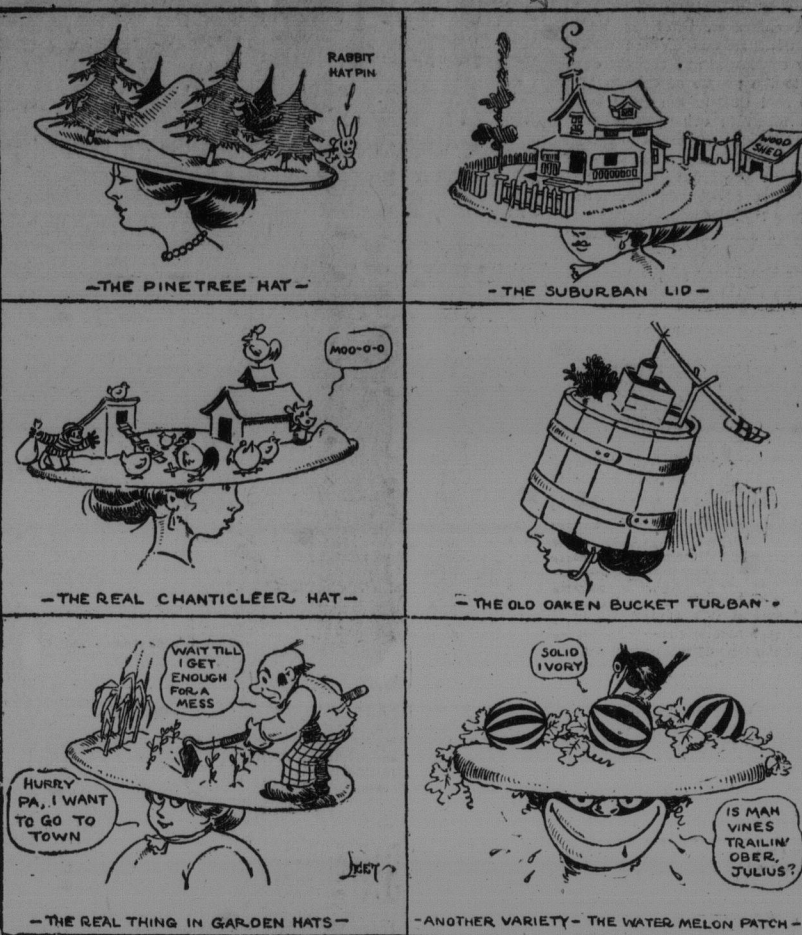

19 U. S. CITIES OVER 250,000

Three Rank Among Ten Large-
est In The World—Twenty
Two Doubled In Population
In Ten Years.

(New York Times.)
The final recapitulation of the re-
cent census figures for the larger cit-
ies of the United States show that
there are nineteen with more than
250,000 inhabitants, and of these three
rank among the ten largest cities of
the world. These in the order of
their magnitude are London, New
York, Paris, Tokyo, Chicago, Berlin,
Vienna, St. Petersburg, Philadelphia
and Moscow. Four American cities
have reached the 250,000 mark since
1900—Newark, Los Angeles, Minneap-
olis, and Jersey City.

The order of the five largest cit-
ies of the United States has remained
the same for twenty years. They are
New York, Chicago, Philadelphia, St.
Louis and Boston, Baltimore and
Cleveland, which were sixth and sev-
enth in 1900, have changed places in
the interval. Los Angeles, jumping
from thirty-fourth to seventeenth, has
increased in actual population in ten
years from 102,479 to 219,198.

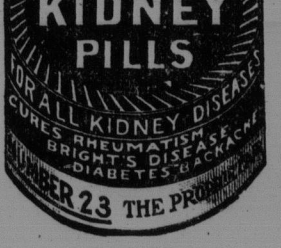

the tables.
From this group one city has fallen
back into the list made up of those
with a population from 25,000 to
100,000. It is St. Louis, Mo., which
was 102,879 in 1900, and is now only
77,402. This second group has 178
cities, 167 of which were in the same
group ten years ago, while 70 have
grown above the 25,000 limit since
then. Taken in the aggregate these
cities show an increase of 39.1 per
cent. from 1900 to 1910, as compared
with 34.3 per cent. in the previous de-
cade, and show a larger proportionate
gain than the larger cities.

Of the 228 cities having at least
25,000 inhabitants, 154 are in the Nor-
thern States, 43 in the Southern
States, and 21 in the Western States.
About one-third show an increase of
more than 50 per cent. since 1900. Of
the Northern cities, about one-fifth
show such an increase; of the South-
ern cities about two-fifths, and of the
Western cities about three-fourths.
None of those in the West show
any increase.

The nineteen cities that have more
than a quarter of a million in popu-
lation are, in the order of their rank,
New York, Chicago, Philadelphia, St.
Louis, Boston, Cleveland, Baltimore,
Pittsburgh, Detroit, Buffalo, San Fran-
cisco, Milwaukee, Cincinnati, Newark,
New Orleans, Washington, Los An-
geles, Minneapolis and Jersey City.
They range in population from 4,766,
883 to 2,677,779.
