## Ottawa, Feb. 6.—One of the greatest

games of the season in the National  
Hockey League took place this even-  
ing at the Laurier Avenue Arena, when  
the Ottawa and Canadian  
teams crossed sticks in the opening  
fixture of the second half of the  
championship race. Ottawa outplayed  
and out-generated the Flying French-  
men for the greater part of the match  
and won 6 to 3. Fast, furious hockey  
marked the contest from beginning  
to end, and one of the largest crowds  
of the winter cheered Eddie Gerard  
and his senators wildly as they scored  
their first victory of this season over  
the Canadiens.
