It is with deep regret that your Committee has to record the removal from amongst us by death of several old and valued members. Alexander Pope, for two years Secretary of the Society, and from the 5th January, 1890, its second Vice-President, and for twenty-two years a life member, died on the 10th March; a resolution, expressive of the high esteem in which he was held by the members, was unanimously adopted at a general meeting of the Society, on the 25th March last.
