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The Hospital

A public spirited citizen full of the Good Samaritan spirit which makes all the world a brotherhood started out some twenty odd years ago with a subscription list expecting at most to raise \$8,000 to build a hospital to care for the sick and injured of the then village of Medicine Hat.

The writer could tell you how instead of \$8,000 this good citizen, through his untiring efforts, raised the fund to \$20,000. It was then decided by the provisional board of directors to widen the scope of the work and to build and equip a general hospital with a training school for nurses to be added as soon as the number of patients under treatment warranted the establishment of such an institution. For many years the Medicine Hat General Hospital with its training school for nurses served the needs of the whole Northwest of Canada.

The good work done by this hospital, the lives saved, the suffering relieved and the well-trained nurses sent out by the school to become the nursing superintendents of similar institutions in other towns is a matter of Territorial history. For many years the whole northwest has benefited from the good work done by this hospital.

Through the efforts of the hospital, the lives of the people of the city and surrounding country have been such as to necessitate the doubling of the capacity of the General Hospital. The new building, a new wing, the new summer and a new wing, with the remodeling of the old building, nearly \$25,000, is now almost ready for occupation. About half this amount will be met by transferring funds from the General Hospital account and by a grant of \$5,000 from the city.

The Board of Directors expects to raise at least half the balance by private subscription in the city and vicinity, and an appeal is hereby made to the citizens of the city and vicinity. It is not necessary to point out to an intelligent public the need of such an institution in the city or the duty of everyone to support it. A single thought as to the right a city the size of Medicine Hat would be in without a hospital should convince even the most skeptical regarding his duty towards his unfortunate neighbor. No matter if the policy of management carried out by the Board under the instructions of the Board, the hospital is a public meeting does not meet with your approval it does not lessen your duty toward your fellow man. No matter if any public institution is supported by the entire community. Even the government of Canada is opposed by nearly half the people.
