Of German descent. S. of a U.E. Loyalist. B. in Osnabruck, Co. Stormont, Ont., 1814. Ed. there. M. Miss Catherine Valentine Loucks, the dau. of a U.E. Loyalist. Is Lieut. 2nd Batt. Stormont Militia. Was fourteen years a member of the Municipal Council, during which time he was successively Deputy Reeve, Reeve, and finally Warden of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry. Sat for present seat in Can. Assembly from 1861 until the Union. Returned to Commons at last g. e. A Liberal; supports present Administration.—*Aultville, Ont.*
