and also that the Vessel shall not be engaged in any other Trade or Employment than what is set forth in the Licence, &c.

that fuch Ship, Vessel, or Boat, shall not be employed, or be found or discovered to have been out of the Limits within which such Ship, Vesfel, or Boat, shall or may be licensed to navigate or trade, contrary to the Directions and Provisions of an Act, passed in the Twenty-seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for making further Provisions in regard to fuch Vessels as are particularly described in an Act, made in the Twenty-fourth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for the more effectual Prevention of Smuggling in this Kingdom, and for extending the faid Act to other Vessels and Boats not particularly described therein, and for other Purposes; and also that such Ship, Vessel, or Boat, shall not be engaged for or used in any Trade or Employment whatever, other than that described and set forth in the Licence for such Ship, Vessel, or Boat, contrary to an Act, passed in the Thirty-eighth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, to prevent Vessels licensed by the Admiralty from being engaged in any Trade or Employment not permitted by their Licences; and also that such Ship, Vessel, or Boat, shall not be used or employed in any other Way or Manner whatever, contrary to the Laws in force relating to the Revenue of Customs on and immediately before the passing of this Act.
