
Women still face sexual discrimination at UNB

to a 122 page report released by the president's advisory committee on the status of women, women at U.N.B. still continue to experience sexual discrimination and harrasement.

The report, "Of more than academic interest: women at U.N.B." takes a hard look at the progress women have made towords equality since the last report on equality, written by a task force in 1976, which included ninety three recomendations to the university, aimed at eliminating sexual descrimination. Unfortunately, to date, the university has only implimented seventeen of these recomendations. The committee has also found that for women faculty members and staff there is often absence of
