NEW GUARANTEES FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.

AN ELECTED, EFFECTIVE SENATE WITH LARGER REPRESENTATION FOR THE ATLANTIC REGION.

In New Brunswick, the Senate will be elected by the people. It will also be equal since every province will have six seats. This means New Brunswick will have as many seats in the Senate as Ontario or Quebec. And other changes to the Constitution give the Senate real power. For the first time in Canadian history, the Senate will exercise a strong voice in national affairs and Atlantic Canada will have just under 40 percent of all Senate seats.
