Uplands, Ontario	21-3-41		<p>During night flying at 0300 hours, two aircraft collided on runway causing considerable damage. Weather during morning overcast, clearing at noon and becoming fine and warm. Training of Course 23, 57 Australians, started with an address to the Class by Group Captain F.S. McGill in G.I.S. followed by a talk by the C.F.I., Squadron Leader W.R. MacBrien. Students were allotted to Flights and training now under way. Night flying started in but had to be washed out on account of water from the runways splashing up and freezing on the wings of aircraft. Flying Officer Grant brought in Fleet Finch 4780 from St. Hubert. Group Captain F.S. McGill departed for Montreal by air 1610 hours.</p>
