Mr. King wishes me to acknowledge your communication of the 22nd instant, in which you refer to previous correspondence regarding an appointment under the Department of Industrial Relations, and express certain views on the industrial problem, which Mr. King has been much interested in reading.

In reply I am desired to say that it is impossible at this time to give any word that might encourage you to hope for an association with the Department. Up to the present, no organization has been attempted, and it is extremely unlikely that any staff will be engaged for a considerable time. Mr. King regrets that a more satisfactory answer cannot be made to your inquiry, but wishes me to thank you for your statement and for your renewed offer of assistance, and to assure you that your communications will be kept on record, to be considered when appointments are to be made.
