

do so: that not infrequently you remain at your home until four o'clock in the afternoon and then come down to your office: that much inconvenience is caused to the public generally and to the Indians who desire to see you and who have a right to expect to find you at your office during regular office hours. I have been informed of this both by parties who are in and out of the Service of the Dept.

I trust, therefore, that there will be a change for the better in the above respect, and that you will, as you state you are prepared to
