I had previously read of the \$100,000 gift, but there has been, in the Eastern papers, so little comment that I was very glad to have the additional information which the newspaper clippings contained. If the living conditions of the miners can be materially raised, and they can be made an industrious and happy people, I am sure that you will feel fully retarded for whatever anxieties and labors your duties may have imposed.

It is indeed a great pleasure to learn of your brother's improved health. He has fought a very brave fight, and victory seems in sight. This victory is not only for him and his wife, but it has been made possible wolely by you, and I rejoice with you over the realization that your brother is to be restored to a usefulness, perhaps greater than he has ever yet rendered or expected.

I have received from Mrs. Wilson, an acknowledgment of the receipt of the play which I mailed to her. She has promised to read it
