

- Q. You have been using it ever since?  
A. Yes.
- Q. You told the Court that it was around 1800 hrs 9 May that you say you saw the accused?  
A. Yes.
- Q. Are you quite sure of the time?  
A. Close as I can remember, yes.
- Q. Could it be half an hour later or half an hour earlier?  
A. It could be.
- Q. Could it be an hour later or a half an hour earlier?  
A. It could be.
- Q. Could it be an hour earlier or later?  
A. I don't think so, Sir.
- Q. The extreme limits would be half an hour each way?  
A. Yes, Sir.
- Q. You also told the Court that you were standing in front of Hut AH 3? Just whereabouts in relation to the hut?  
A. I was standing at approximately the second window from the hut closest to Hut 2.
- Q. Would it be fair to state that you would be some 300 feet from #4 cell block?  
A. I would say slightly less.
- Q. As a matter of fact I measured it roughly when you told the Court on the map (Exhibit "I") and I made it at least 300 feet. Would you say I was wrong?  
A. No, Sir, I have no map.
- Q. Would you say 300 feet is approximately correct?  
A. Yes.
- Q. Was the sun shining at this time?  
A. I don't recall.
- Q. If the sun had been shining is it a fact that it would be behind the accused?  
A. I don't know, Sir.
- Q. #4 cell block is farther west than #3 living hut?  
A. Yes.
- Q. So if the sun had been shining, which you don't recall, it would be behind the accused?  
A. It could have been.
- Q. What sort of a day was it?  
A. Fairly bright.
- Q. Likely the sun was shining?  
A. I don't know; we were on double summer time.
- Q. You say when you first saw the accused he was on top of the cell block?  
A. Yes, Sir.
- Q. Were the other SUS on top?  
A. Gravel, Sir.
- Q. Did you know both Gravel and the accused by name at that time?

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
