Toronto, July 26.-While we bad the co mparatively light run this morning of
38 loads, 20 came in yesterday, but 38 loads, 20 came in yesterday, but offerings close on 60 loads. The receipts included 1430 lambs, and sheep, early 700 hogs, 60 calves, and a few milkers. The marké̀ was little changd, except for hogs, which were firmer. The trade at Mintreal was very bad yesterday, in fact, really in worse slape was a good deal of buying, but prices was a good deal of baying, but prices o lower prices still further. Late in the day a more active business was done and little stuff of any consequence remained unsold.
Export cattle-Trade was slow, and prices were around 4 c for ordinary good shipping cattle - Several times 4 c c was pd by Mr. James Eakins 4tc was realized. The range however, can be put at from $3 \frac{1}{2}$ to $4 \frac{4}{2}$ c for good shippers and they had to be good to fetch the latter figure. Among the sales were six loads averaging from 1,270 to $1,360 \mathrm{lbs}$, which sold at from 4 to 4 foc 3 loads averaging close on 1400 lbs , sold at 4 c and $\$ 5$ over a load of 23 sold at $3 t \mathrm{c}$, averaging 1,250 to $1,300 \mathrm{lbs}$, sold at 3 zice. Very little of the cattle could be called strictly first class.
Butchers' cattle-It would be incorrect to say that the top price was 4c, though that figure was occasionally paid for picked lots of choice. For really good stuff 34 to 3 3c was the range; very
fair sattle sold readily at 3 c per lb , and some of it much lower ; secondary stuff brought $2 \frac{t}{f}$ to $2{ }_{4}^{3} \mathrm{c}$, and inferior sold very slowly at around 2 c per ib . Among the sales were found one lot of 10 very choice cattle averaging $1,095 \mathrm{Ib4}$, sold at $\$ 3.75$ per cwt; a load, averaging $1,100 \mathrm{lbs}$, sold at $3 \mathrm{fc} ; 23$ averaging $1,075 \mathrm{lbs}$, sold at $3 \neq \mathrm{c} ; 23$ averaging
$1,075 \mathrm{lbs}$, sold at $\$ 31$ each; 10 averag. ing 1,000 lbs, sold at $\$ 35$ each; 25 aver970 lbs , sold at $2 \frac{1}{2} \mathrm{c}$ per lb ; 14 averaging 1.100 lbs , sold at $\$ 34.50$ each. These were well fed cattle. Twenty-three, averaging $1,050 \mathrm{lbs}$, sold at 3 c ; and several lots from 900 to 975 lbs , sold at from $2 \frac{1}{4}$ to $2 \frac{1}{2} \mathrm{C}$ per lb .
A few stockers were purchased at $2 \frac{1}{c} \mathrm{c}$ per lb , but there is uo special demand
as yet, but about the midale of next month Mr. Halligan will require about 300 for export.
Milkers - There was no quotable clazge, but a rather better feeling ex isted, and we had a slight demand. Sheep and lambs-Exporisheep wer selling at $3 \frac{1}{2}$ c as the top figure, but the tendency is towark off, and sold from $\$ 1.75$ to $\$ 2.50$ each. There were to Hogs-We had an appreciable ad vance, and for very choice, off cars, $\$ 5.25$ was paid; thick fat were firm at $\$ 4.60$ and $\$ 4.70$ per cwt; but stores wer $\$ 4.25$; stores may be considered as not wanted.

The market was fairly active and owing to a wrangle among export bayers, prices were ligher for some fair to good mixed sheep, $\$ 2.25$ to $\$ 2.60$ common to fair, $\$ 1.5 \mathrm{~J}$ to $\$ 2$; fair to choice yearing, $\$ 2.75$ to $\$ 3.25$; best enod, $\$ 3.25$ to $\$ 40$.
