CANADIAN CROP REPORT

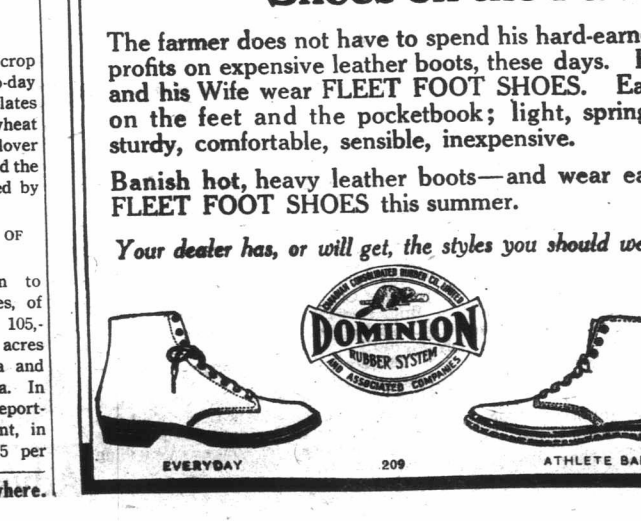
