Mr. Baker is a native of Lunenburg County, and when a student for the ministry spent a few weeks in Shelburne, and later was in charge of the Baptist church at Sable River for two years. He is an able preacher and has recently completed, a sixty thousand dollar church in Montreal. Mr. Baker preached at Sable last Sunday and attended the Baptist Quarterly at Sandy Point this week.
