LEGISLATORS MEET AND BEGIN BUSINESS

Speech from the Throne Discussed and Address in Reply Adopted—Mr. Haultain Issues Challenge to Do His Worst—Three Ministers Not in Their Places—W. C. Sutherland Chosen as Speaker.

The first session of the second legislative assembly of Saskatchewan opened with usual ceremonies on Thursday last.

W. C. Sutherland, member for Saskatchewan county was elected Speaker.

SPEECH FROM THRONE
The lieutenant governor then read the speech from the throne which is as follows:

Mr. Speaker and Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly:
I am pleased to welcome you to the first session of the Second Legislative Assembly of Saskatchewan.

The number of important institutions of our province were well begun by the first legislature. You have inspiring opportunity for invaluable work in building upon those foundations. Harmonious sentiments prevail in a highly gratifying degree amongst our people. Nothing now exists to distract your attention from earnest efforts towards promoting the common well being of all.

The larger representation granted by the act under the provisions of which you have been elected cannot fail to bring the general benefit to be derived from closer association of the people with their representatives. This needful increase of representation will naturally cause attention to be directed towards the fast growing volume of work falling upon the government.

WILLIAMS FOR MAYOR

R. H. Williams Secured 19 More Votes than Dr. Thomson—Ald. Peverett a Victor in a Hot Fight in Ward 4—The Public and Separate School Trustees.

Monday was civic election day in Regina, but outside the contest for the mayoralty and the aldermanic fight in ward 4, not much enthusiasm was worked up.

The Dominion Parliament will Open on January 20th—Mr. Charles Marcell is to be the New Speaker—Cause of Delay.

Ottawa, Dec. 11.—Wednesday, Jan. 20th was decided on by the cabinet council today as the date for the opening of the first session of the eleventh Canadian Parliament.

Lumsden, a Dry Town

Lumsden has been agitated for the past few weeks over the local option proposition.

The council in response to a petition submitted by a bylaw providing for the abolition of the bar, to the electors on Monday and the result of the vote indicates that that is a temperance town. Out of 133 votes cast, 84 favored prohibition while the other 49 were against it.

Interest in the by-law was much greater than in the election of mayor and councillors. The result of the latter makes S. Mathieson mayor for 1909 and Messrs. D. M. Balfour, A. S. Balfour and J. S. Wright aldermen.
