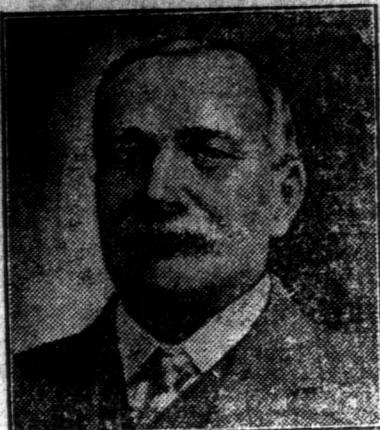
### THE HAPSBURGS

Archduke Joseph and his little Hapsburg cabinet didn't stay long in the saddle in Bucharest. It was hardly to be expected that they would. There was no guarantee to the Allies that the chaos in this half of the former dual monarchy would be ended by the return to power of a scion of the ancient family which, if not quite as much to blame for the war, at least furnished the spark which started the engine of battle and furnished real aid to the Hohenzollern campaigns.

Hungary was never satisfied under Hapsburg rule. The heterogeneous masses comprising that portion of Europe seethed with discontent and revolt long before the murders at Sarajevo in June, 1914, and it was only a question of time when the ferment of the conflicting races would have resulted in an explosion. 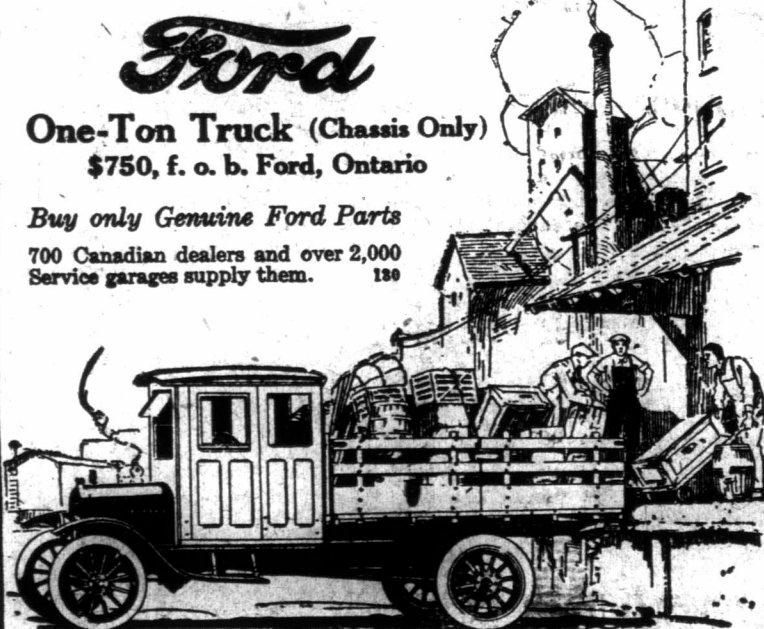

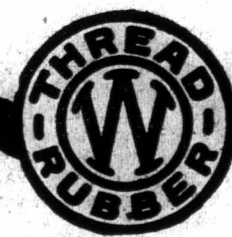
