Wireless on the Great Lakes. Wireless telegraphy proved of inestimable value during the past season in the movement of vessels of the great lakes. By its use the captains of vessels were kept in almost constant touch with the offices of their companies and in many instances orders were given them, changing plans by which thousands of dollars were saved to the shipowners, under circumstances which could not have been accomplished in any other manner. In some cases, it is said, that rush messages were delivered in three minutes' time. The value of the service in this capacity is demonstrated by the fact that although it was not fully in operation until the latter part of the season, no less than 70,000 were exchanged. At the opening of the season there were but two stations in operation and three were put into service.

He was then searched by the police and a bank book, showing deposits of \$1,452, was found. The man's name is Thomas Cantizaro, and he is 47 years old.

GOT \$8,000. The Young Lady Was Injured In Essex Dynamite Explosion. Sandwich, Ont., April 30.—Miss May Cockburn, formerly telephone operator at Essex, has been awarded \$8,000 damages from the M. C. R. for injuries sustained in the Essex dynamite explosion by the jury at the assizes. The original claim was for \$5,000 damages, but after hearing evidence by medical experts, Judge Anglin granted a motion by Attorney Rodd to increase the claim to \$10,000, and the jury was out only a short time before deciding on the \$8,000 award. It was announced last night that a settlement had practically been agreed on in all the other cases except one.

DECREASED REVENUE. (Special Despatch to the Times.) Ottawa, Ont., April 30.—The Customs revenue for the month of April was \$3,499,347, a decrease of \$1,018,846, as compared with April of last year, due to the continued decrease of imports consequent upon the caution now being exercised by wholesalers and others, in the matter of purchases from abroad during the period of depression.

CHEVALIER GOT OFF. Windsor, April 30.—W. H. Chevalier, of Windsor, charged with manslaughter in connection with the death of Balfour Baby last October, was acquitted.

GOT DEGREES. Montreal, April 30.—Sir C. Purdon Clarke, director of the Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York, and Dr. Tury, Principal of Albert University, received degrees of LL.D. to-day at McGill.

FINANCIAL ITEMS. Interborough bonds were largely over-subscribed. Spot copper in London is 15s higher and futures 10s higher. The New York banks lost \$2,078,000 through sub-Treasury operations since Friday last. Custer, Knapp & Co., of the New York Stock Exchange, failed to-day. Interborough financing provides for needs of next two years. Plenty of stocks in loan crowd. M. K. & T. will not sell bonds in treasury, unless rumored. Railroad financing to the extent of \$150,000,000 expected in the next few weeks, so many roads need money, not merely to finance improvements in progress, but to liquidate floating debt already incurred.
