"A GHOST SEEN IN NOODAY"

THE STORY WHICH IS EXCITING ENGLAND.

We have received the following extraordinary narrative from a correspondent for whose faith and professional acuteness of observation we can vouch. He substantiates his story of full details of dates, names, places, which, however, for sake of the survivors, he does not wish to be published. As my wife and I were sitting breakfast with a guest who will call Mr. A.--then on a for the first time to our home and neighborhood--our servant passed out of the room on her way to the kitchen. She closed the door Mr. A. started me by saying: "I saw a spirit man following that woman who, as he passed, said distinctly in my hearing, 'God judgeth as man judgeth. I was innocent of the murder for which have been hanged.'" "What is it like?" I asked. He replied by describing a young Irish whom I recognized at once the husband of my domestic who a year or two before had been executed on the charge of murder. Mr. A., a complete stranger to the locality, had met me for the first time days before, and he was to ignorant of the crime in which my servant was so deeply interested. For obvious reasons, the subject was never alluded to in our household, where the wife was regarded with feeling sympathy, which led us to do as much as possible all reference to her husband's fate had previously good reason doubt whether the evidence against him justified his execution. He had died protesting his innocence. His wife's friends were firmly convinced that although he had been the fight, it was not by his fault the fatal blow had been dealt. In addition to this, I had reason to believe that the murderer was still at large, and could easily give me assistance when I thus suddenly ventured upon forbidden ground, and abruptly declared that the spirit of a man who suffered the capital penalty whose personal appearance actually coincided with that of an unfortunate Irishman, was truly following the servant about the house proclaiming his innocence in accents though inaudible to me, guest declared were perfectly audible to him. I had heard that Mr. A. had been a spirit, but I was not a little startled by this striking illustration of peculiar faculty. I remember that it was very strange, and formed him that the woman whom he had just seen for the first time when her ghostly companion was really the widow of an executed felon.
