

Liao Yang, June 30.—The Japanese are reported to have retired ten to wenty miles from the posts which they recently held. Owing to heavy rain it is thought the operations north of Port Arthur have been indefinitely postpond. It is unofficially stated that the Russian fleet put out from Port Arthur several days ago and incountered the Japs fleet. In the ensuing engagement between the two fleets three ships were lost. No details of the engagement are available here.

Liao Yang, July 2 - General Kuropatkin and general Kuroki are moving roops like men on a chess board. The Japanese are now twenty miles from Liao Yang. Rains are impeding the movements.
