





A DANGEROUS PRACTICE.—Last night on New Gower Street a number of boys exploded giant fire crackers which burst on several occasions at the feet of passing pedestrians. The report of these could be heard blocks away, and they threw showers of sparks about. Officers Whalen and Aylward chased the boys away, but secured their names and will summon them.

Last evening about 8 o'clock one of the employees of Mr. W. Spurrell's Tailoring Store on the Beach, named Andrews, went to throw some kerosene oil from a jar on the fire which had gone low.
