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ANOTHER LARGE LOAN.

LONDON, To-day. Andrew Bonar Law, Chancellor of the Exchequer, introduced in the Commons to-day a formal resolution authorizing the Treasury to borrow another two hundred and fifty million pounds on the security of the Consolidated Fund of the United Kingdom. He announced a war loan bill for this purpose will be introduced within a few days. The resolution was adopted.

BERLIN, To-day. HOSPITAL SHIPS MAY BE IMMUNE.

LONDON, To-day. The Evening Standard says it has high authority for stating that negotiations are in progress with every expectation of success towards securing immunity for Hospital Ships from submarine attacks. According to a dispatch from Madrid published by the Standard, it has been arranged that a Spanish Naval Officer will go aboard every hospital ship as a guarantee that the ship is used only for transport of sick and wounded.
